
Washing your wrapped car at home is easy with the right tools and a little know-how—just like when you <u>prepare your vehicle for a wrap</u>.


Step-by-Step Guide:

- 1. Rinse the car with clean water to remove loose dirt.
- 2. Use a soft microfiber mitt and pH-balanced wrap-safe car shampoo.
- 3. Wash in small sections to prevent soap drying.
- 4. Rinse thoroughly.
- 5. Dry with a clean microfiber towel (no air drying).

Pro Tips:

- 1. Avoid waxing or polishing unless using wrap-safe products.
- 2. Never use abrasive sponges or scrubbers.
- 3. Don't wash under direct sunlight to avoid water spots.





Common Washing Errors That Can Destroy Your Wrap

Even the best wraps can't withstand abuse. Here are the most common cleaning mistakes that lead to early wrap failure, which can even impact <u>paint protection</u>:

- 1. Using automatic brushes
- 2. Power-washing too close to edges
- 3. Ignoring bird droppings or sap (can stain)
- 4. Using household cleaners like Windex or dish soap
- 5. Letting grime build up over weeks
